Circumstance Just because The King of heaven and earth was born in a manger doesn't mean the impact of His life was limited. Why should we let circumstance limit ours? Even George Washington felt inadequate because of his lack of advanced, classical education. Yet we have leaders today who, despite their impressive credentials, still encourage dependence instead of freedom. If you know someone who feels circumstances are getting in the way of being great—especially if that person is you—come ready to learn how we can become who God intended us to be. This painting, inspired by the lessons I found in the writings of Isaiah, is packed with symbolism. Together, we'll explore that symbolism and how it can help us to accept the past, clarify the present, and create the future God intends for us.
